Ski lift company for Les 2 Alpes

Since 1 December 2020, the lifts in Les 2 Alpes have been managed by SATA Group (it used to be Compagnie des Alpes under the name Deux Alpes Loisirs). SATA also manages the ski lifts in Alpe d'Huez and La Grave.

Fabrice Boutet, the CEO of SATA Group, says: "It is a great challenge to have integrated Les 2 Alpes in the group. Les 2 Alpes and Alpe d'Huez are under the same management but each resort will keep its identity."

SATA Group is investing €290 million in Les 2 Alpes over the next 30 years. The first part of the plan will take place over the next five years and will cost €150 million. It includes redesigning the ski areas and investing in new snow-making equipment. SATA Group will also work on developing the bike areas in the summer and creating new activities.

The mayor of Les 2 Alpes, Christophe Aubert, says: "SATA is going to offer a bright future to Les 2 Alpes. The resort won't only be a ski resort, but a fourseason destination."

New luxury chalets and residences



Chalets Black COMBS and White COMBS

Located by the Combe Noire, these stunning chalets overlook the resort and have beautiful panoramic views of the La Muzelle mountain peak and the Massif des Écrins. They can each sleep up to 15 guests. In Venosc

Les 2 Alpes was built on the 'Alpe' (the mountain pasture) of two villages: Venosc and Mont de Lans. This is why the resort was named Les 2 Alpes. Venosc is a traditional alpine village with narrow cobbled streets, old chalets, fountains and a 14th century church. It is linked to the resort by a gondola.

The Oisans Valley was famous for its slate, which was considered to be like black gold. Until 1971, Venosc had a slate factory, making high-quality slate tiles, some of which are still on the roof of the Palace of Versailles.

A new signposted track will open this summer, starting in the village and going as far as the old slate factory, allowing visitors to learn about the history of the village. The signs are in French and English. The tour is 1.5km long, with a climb of 235m.

Le Cours de la Vie is a new restaurant in a beautifully renovated house from the 17th century, in the centre of the village. The owners, Mathilde and Stephane, offer a traditional but refined cuisine made with local produce. They also have a takeaway service. www.lecoursdelavie.fr

Venosc has some excellent art and crafts shops and galleries. A new one has recently opened: **Eco Be Class**. It sells jewels, trays, and other objects made with recycled glass. www.ecobeglass.com

Two new events for this summer

From 23 to 25 July, Les 2 Alpes will host **Alpes Home**, a show where designers and makers exhibit furniture and decorative objects with a mountain style. www.alpes-home.com

On 7 and 8 August, Les 2 Alpes will organise a challenging e-bike competition, the **Ultimate E-Bike Challenge.** Teams of two will cover over 100km, with between 5,000m and 6,000m of vertical climb and 10,000m of technical descent. They will be able to stop twice to charge their bikes.





BIKING



Mountain biking

Les 2 Alpes is famous for downhill mountain biking. Riders from around the world come to Les 2 Alpes in the summer to enjoy its 90km of runs, located between the foot of the glacier at 3,200m and the villages of Mont de Lans at 1,300m and Venosc at 900m.

Mountain bikers use the lifts to go up and can then choose between green, blue, red or black runs – green being the easiest and black the most difficult. Adults and children can take mountain biking lessons with the UCPA or Gravity Bike (Bureau des Guides).

The security and maintenance of the Bike Park is in the hands of the Bike Patrol. Eight bike patrollers look after the 90km of tracks. They work 700 hours in the spring, 2,000 hours in the autumn and 2,700 hours in the summer when the resort is open.

European Ski School is now organising Mountain Bike Camp -The Camps are aimed at beginner to intermediate level mountain bikers and will be delivered in Les 2 Alpes resort/bike park. It is perfect for people's first experience of Alpine/ downhill mountain biking and also ideal for those with some experience who would like to boost confidence and improve technique. Participants must already be comfortable riding a mountain bike off road before attending this course. The camp costs €300. https://www.europeanskischool.eu/



E-Bikes

The number of riders using electric bikes keeps growing. Les 2 Alpes has dedicated and signposted runs for e-bikes: the Vallée Blanche area, the Venosc area, a track to go from 1,600m to 3,200m, and a track along the Vénéon River. It is possible to hire e-bikes from most sport shops in the resort, and bike schools organise outings on dedicated itineraries. Aventure Electrobike organises rides at sunset. Riders cycle up to the Diable au Coeur restaurant at 2,400m, where they enjoy an aperitif and a barbecue before riding down by night (with a headlight). It costs €50 per person.



Road cycling

Les 2 Alpes is a great base for cyclists who want to tackle some of the most legendary mountain passes, such as the Alpe d'Huez, Galibier, Lautaret, Ornon, the Iron Cross and Glandon.

Cyclists can get back to the resort by the Venosc cable car or by cycling the bendy road that goes up the resort (Marco Pantani holds the record by climbing it in 21 minutes!).

The Oisans Cols Séries: every Tuesday during the summer, a road or a mountain pass is closed to cars so that cyclists can enjoy it peacefully and safely.

The road between Bourd d'Oisans and Les 2 Alpes will be closed on 24 August.

SUMMER SKIING



If you feel frustrated about having missed your winter ski holiday, why not try a summer ski holiday?

Les 2 Alpes has Europe's biggest

skiable glacier – and, after a winter of heavy snowfall, the glacier will be in excellent condition for visitors this summer.

Skiers and snowboarders can ride every morning from 7am to 12.30pm, on 30km of slopes located between 3,200m and 3,600m. The glacier is accessible to all levels: there is a beginners area, there are many runs for intermediate and advanced riders, and pro riders come in the summer to train in alpine skiing and freestyle in the snowpark.

Freestyle for children: every week, there is the option for children to get involved in Da Camp, where they ride the snowpark every morning from 9am to 1pm. In the afternoon, they can practise their tricks on the trampoline. They also get involved in other afternoon activities, including mountain boarding, beach volleyball and rafting, as well as having the opportunity for video analysis of their tricks.

A well-preserved glacier: to achieve the best possible summer skiing, Les 2 Alpes spends a lot of time working on the glacier all year round to ensure it is in optimal condition and to preserve it. This includes harvesting snow on the glacier and distributing it daily to ensure great snow coverage and wellmaintained pistes.

The glacier is also accessible

to pedestrians. Both skiers and pedestrians can access the Belvédère des Écrins – a 7m long skywalk at the top of the glacier at 3,400 metres, where they'll be blown away by the unique 360-degree views! They can also visit the ice cave and stop for a coffee or lunch at the restaurant at 3,200m.



INTERVIEW WITH JEREMY EDWARDS

the founder and owner of European Ski School



When did you start European Ski School?

At the beginning, we were only a summer skiing company running under the name of SKI 3000. We specialized in bringing Italian guests over the border for summer skiing courses and summer activities. From 1993 we saw an opportunity for running a more British orientated ski school in Les 2 Alpes, so we opened all year round to the general public under our new name European Ski & Snowboard School. I feel privileged to have been able to teach skiing both in summer and winter seasons for over 30 years. And now I am extremely proud to pass on the management of the family ski school to my sons Lawrence and Simon Edwards who have skied throughout their lives both summer and winter in Deux Alpes.

You grew up in England, so how did your passion for skiing start?

As a child, I was extremely lucky to ski with my parents. For our first ski trip, Dad drove our family of 5 in a mini minor all the way to Austria. From that experience and then from school ski trips financed partially by myself with paper rounds, Saturday jobs, picking potatoes, plucking Turkeys at Christmas, etc, my passion for skiing had begun. When your passion is so strong for something you find ways to achieve your ambitions and later after having worked in ski shops, on the ski lifts, safety patrol and having done extensive training I became fully qualified to teach skiing in Europe. This process was not easy as I was not born on skis however it helped me understand the learning process that skiers go through which I believe has enhanced my teaching skills enormously. My passion led me to opening a ski school and us delivering lessons whilst also providing younger ski instructors the opportunity to train for qualifications to then teach under the umbrella and within the philosophy of the European ski school.

What do you like in Les 2 Alpes in the summer?

We all love the summer ski season, the perfectly groomed gradual gradients of the glacier, the warm weather, the views, then changing into shorts and tee shirts to enjoy a salad lunch by the pool and afterwards enjoying the numerous summer activities available in the resort and the surrounding area.

Could you tell us about summer skiing in Les 2 Alpes?

Compared to the winter, skiing conditions in the summer are generally much warmer and the wideopen area and gradual gradients of the glacier provide a great playing field for all levels of skiers wanting to focus on technique and improving skills. The nature of the snow and machine grooming in the summer provide great hard pack snow for racers early in the morning and late morning, the softening conditions are ideal for beginners and intermediates. Being able to ski or snowboard on the groomed slopes or using the world famous snowpark between 3,200m and 3,600m is quite incredible during the summer months.

Who are your clients?

Our clients in the summer come from a wide range of countries worldwide

and include all levels of skiers or snowboarders. We have clients coming for specialised in house race training camps, Freestyle or snowboard or MTB Bike camps. We also provide traditional ski or snowboard lessons for families and individuals on a daily or weekly basis. Our clients come because they want to combine a ski holiday and a summer holiday into one.

Where are your favourite spots on the glacier?

My favourite spot on the glacier is at 3,600m - teaching at the very top ski lift, (Dôme de la Lauze), is spectacular. I also love the steeper red run that cuts straight down the glacier from 3,600m (Les Cines/Signal 2) to the bottom of the Signal blue at 2,900m. The Belvédère des Ecrins, just above the Snowpark, lets you take heartstopping steps into the abyss above the Vallon de la Selle. Standing above a 1,000m drop gives you a unique view of the mountains. The Grotte de Glace ice cave is not to be missed either. The ice sculptures are wonderful but what I really like is the chance to see the inside of the glacier and touch the thousands-of-years-old ice.

Do you need special equipment to ski in the summer?

No, normal ski equipment is all that you need. Make sure you take enough warm clothes for the snow, even though you might be basking in a heatwave at lower altitudes. To make the most of the terrain and to make sure you stay safe we would recommend taking an instructor, especially if you are unfamiliar with skiing on the glacier. Any activity over 3,000m can be more tiring than at resort level so you might feel slightly more out of breath as you ski or board.

BE ACTIVE IN THE MOUNTAINS

At high altitude, there is less oxyge in the air that we breathe. Breathing less oxygen (hypoxia) helps create new pathways for the blood vessels, allowing oxygen to flow. Life at altitude helps people to have healthier hearts. Altitude also offers the possibility of improving cardiac performance and therefore sport performance, which is why professional athletes come to train at altitude. However, you don't need to be a professional athlete to enjoy the benefits of a holiday in the mountains.





Hiking

Les 2 Alpes has over 200km of beautiful hiking tracks. Le Bureau des Guides organises different types of guided walks:

- **The Chamois walk** to observe this beautiful alpine animal, who is difficult to see.

- **Foraging walks** to learn about the local plants that can be eaten or used as natural medicines.

It costs €25 for a full day or €20 for a half day. Children under 13 years old pay €17 for a full day or €10 for a half day.

- Ice walks on the glacier, with crampons and an ice axe. Children aged 10 and older can do an ice walk. It costs €80 for an adult and €70 for children between 10 and 13. www.guides2alpes.com

Trail running

Les 2 Alpes has four marked trails for different levels:

A green run: Les Balcons de Venosc, which is 11km long.

A blue run: Pied-Moutet, which is 20km long.

A red run: La Brèche du Grand Creux, which is 30km long.

A very challenging **2.4km run between Venosc village and Les 2 Alpes**, with a 700m climb.

Try something new


There's no better way of really letting go than a tandem paragliding flight with an instructor: clear your head, gaze over the mountaintops, and observe the fauna and flora from the air.

Try white water rafting or hydro speed

In the turquoise waters of the Vénéon River in Venosc.

Cani-rando

Is a summer version of dog sledding. This is a great activity for children. It is €25 for a two-hour ride.





Leap on an airbag

you can launch yourself into the air on a doughnut-style rubber ring from a launch ramp and land safely on an airbag (crash mat). Over 7s only, every afternoon, €3 per jump.

Visitors can also play golf

skate in the resort's big skate park, take yoga classes... or just watch the world passing by while sitting on one of the many bar and restaurant terraces.



INTERVIEW WITH ALEXANDRA ARMAND

owner of TipTop Ski Coaching and outdoor sports addict



You grew up in England, so when did you move to Les 2 Alpes?

I have been in Les 2 Alpes for over 15 years and love the resort and surrounding areas. I originally chose the resort for the skiing and spent only winters here. I soon realised what I was missing out on and started living all year round here and enjoying all the seasons and all the sports. The mountains offer so much to do and enjoy. The glacier and bike park in the summer are a real bonus!

What are your favourite activities?

I love to ski and to share my skiing knowledge with people to allow them to improve their skills and therefore enjoy the mountains more and more each year. Skiing is available in the summer on the glacier and there is nothing better than getting up early and seeing the sun rise over the mountains up at 3,400m! My other passions are biking, Road and MTB, for which the Oisans area and Les 2 Alpes is second to none for. I also enjoy hiking and running in our wonderful mountains.

Describe your perfect summer day in Les 2 Alpes


Skiing in the morning, working on technique with my group and of course skiing and enjoying ourselves as we go! Down to the resort for lunch - my favourite places are Casa Nostra on their terrace or Igloo for their burgers, then off out on the mountain bike I love my afternoons in the bike park riding the rolling blues or challenging myself on the reds (I've not quite reached black level as yet!). My favourite MTB run is the Valley Blanche Blue, it is open, quick running with lots of little jumps - great fun!

If I still have some energy, I go running. I run on the "Voie Verte" between Bourg D'oisans and Venosc - from Les Deux Alpes take the telecabine down to Venosc and join this amazing track that follows the river. I finish the day with a cold drink on the terrace of the Polar Bear pub. For dinner I like Le Cellier for its fantastic steaks cooked over the burning fire in the restaurant. Another great place to eat is the Chamois Lodge, they have a fabulous wine list and their cocktails are something special!



FOOD AND DRINKS

Les 2 Alpes has a large choice of activities, but also many places to eat and drink!

The resort has 80 restaurants. From mountain cuisine to Italian, Corsican and vegetarian, there is something for all tastes and budgets. There is also a Michelin-star restaurant, **Le P'tit Polyte**.

Café Edina is the place to go for brunch.

Crêpes à Gogo is a real institution in the resort. It has been serving delicious savoury and sweet pancakes for over 30 years.

Le Grain de Sel is a gastronomic restaurant with a friendly and relaxed atmosphere.

The mountain restaurant **Le Diable au Coeur** brews its own beer, La Bière des Glaciers.

Le Chamois Lodge is the place to go for cocktails. They have an extensive list of cocktails and roocktails – some classic and some more unusual! For a treat during the day or for goodies to bring back home, we recommend the following places.

At **Le Chat Gourmand**, local chocolatier and pastry chef Pascal Chat gets up very early every morning to make his delicious cakes. Try the Oisans pie (a blueberry pie), the threechocolate cake or Les Lauzes (a small square of praline chocolate coated with blueberry or raspberry meringue). Génépi is an alpine digestive made of local plants. Try it at the **Génépi des Sommets**.

Le Vieux Chalet has excellent local produce: saucissons, Crozets (small squares of pasta), local honey and more.
